A Word for What's Ailing You! Trusting When Things Go Wrong

When things go wrong, do you have an inner compulsion to worship God? When life is falling apart, not knowing which way to turn, you feel like your life is hanging by a thread: that is when most of us stop praising God. When your little world caves in, hold on to God's unchanging hands. There are those foolish individuals - when things go wrong forsake God. When things are hanging in the balance, say like David, "Though I walk in the midst of trouble, thou wilt revive me." (Psalm 138:7) You can trust in God to make a way out of no way. David cried out to God and the Lord answered him. (Psalm 138:3) God gave him strength to endure all that he was going through.

During this crisis, look to the hills where our help comes from. In Psalm 18:2 "The Lord is my rock, and my fortress, and my deliverer; my God, my strength, in whom I will trust; my buckler, and the horn of my salvation, and my high tower."

This eighteenth Psalm reminds me of Jesus he came to earth. No matter what happened to Him, no matter what people said about Him, our Lord's unfailing trust in His Father enabled Him to walk with confidence. He knew how to trust God at all times. No matter how unfair and bitter the criticism, no matter how fierce and caustic the opposition, no matter how frowning and fearful the circumstances, He trusted at all times (Psalm 18:3). His trust was always expressed in prayer. Study the life of Jesus and you will see the Lord in close communion with Heaven. He knew what it was to call and conquer, trusting at all times.
