

# Dr. Cullian W. Hill

A native of North Carolina, Pastor Hill came to Flint, Michigan with his parents in 1953. He graduated from Central High School in 1956 and was employed with General Motors from 1956 to 1972. Pastor Hill wanted to further his education so he attended the General Motors Institute pursuing a degree in Business Administration and Management.

Pastor Hill began preaching at Antioch Missionary Baptist Church in Flint, Michigan under the late Dr. L. W. Pryor. In 1971, he started pastoring at Second Baptist Church in Bay City, Michigan, and continued until 1977. While pastoring at Second Baptist Church, Dr. Hill graduated from Midwestern Baptist College in Pontiac, Michigan in 1974. He attended post graduate studies at Ashland Theological Seminary which is an extension of the University of Toledo. Then, Dr. Hill pastored Russell Street Baptist Church in Detroit from May of 1977 until March of 1981. Dr. Cullian W. Hill organized the Greater Concord Missionary Baptist Church on April 12, 1981. Pastor Hill has also completed coursework at Midwestern Baptist College, Ashland Theological Seminary, and Henry Ford Community College.
